Individual reviewers are subject to change based upon possible conflicts of interest and/or availability. Review team members will be advised of any changes to the planned review team prior to the application review period. Each reviewer is trained during the application review year on reviewer protocols and completion of this rubric. Each reviewer will individually complete a rubric to score your application, and all scored rubrics will be combined to determine your average item and overall score.
